Notes for Authors / Instructions for Authors / Paper Submission

The Instructions below include important information on how to prepare and submit your manuscripts for publication in the EU PVSEC Proceedings.

Plenary / Oral Presentations

Speakers of Plenary and Oral presentations hand in their presentation/s at the Presenters' Desk. A technician will control the correct functionality and transfer the presentation to the respective auditorium. Further details regarding Plenary/Oral Presentations can be found in the Notes for Authors

Speakers and Chairpersons of Plenary and Oral sessions meet 15 minutes prior to the start of their session in the respective auditorium in order to be briefed and to become acquainted with audio-visual aid.

Visual / Poster Presentations

Authors of Visual presentations are requested to set up their posters on the allotted boards as early as possible on Monday morning, 24 September and to take them down on Thursday, 27 September, after the last session at 18:30. All Visual presentations should be presented through the full 4 days from Monday to Thursday in the Poster Area. The panel at your disposal will have a maximum display area measuring 0.85 m wide x 1.20 m high. This allows posters of up to A0 format (841 mm x 1189 mm, upright format). The boards will be numbered according to the Conference Programme. Please find all detailed guidelines in the Notes for Authors of Visual Presentations.

Authors of posters are requested to be in-situ at their posters at the session time indicated in the Programme Brochure, in order to present their paper to the audience and to create a Q&A session.

Publication in the EU PVSEC Proceedings

In order to be published in the 35th EU PVSEC 2018 Proceedings, corresponding authors of each presentation have to submit the original paper online between 17th-27th September 2018 in his/ her user area.

Only corresponding authors of each submission may upload final manuscripts. This means that the corresponding author is the only author from each paper that is able to complete the submission (as is the case for abstract submission). If the manuscript is not made available during this period, your paper cannot be published in the Conference Proceedings. The document must be submitted in both Microsoft Word and Adobe Acrobat PDF formats. To upload the paper, corresponding authors have just to follow the step-by-step procedures provided in the user area and complete the mandatory electronic Copyright Transfer Agreement as one of the steps of the online submission. The Copyright Transfer Agreement is compulsory and can only be carried out electronically. During the submission of your paper, you will be taken

automatically to the EU PVSEC electronic copyright form. Your paper submission will not be complete and therefore cannot be published without the electronic copyright submission. The Instructions for Preparation of Papers are available for download on the EU PVSEC website.

You can find computers and technical support for the online submission of final manuscripts on site.

The 35th EU PVSEC 2018 Proceedings gather all scientific papers, which have been presented at the 35th EU PVSEC 2018 and have also been submitted for publication online. It constitutes a comprehensive source of state-of-the-art information and vital point of reference for researchers, technologists, decision-makers, entrepreneurs and all involved in the global PV sector. The EU PVSEC Proceedings will be available online from November 2018.

Prizes and Awards

TRAVEL INFORMATION / TOURIST INFORMATION

How to reach

SQUARE - Brussels Meeting Centre is located in the heart of Brussels, less than 500 m from the Historic City Center and the Grand Place. The Central train station is only 200 m from the SQUARE and it takes less than 30 minutes (by taxi) from Brussels Airport.



By rail

SQUARE is just across the Brussels Central railway station.

National trains: Get off at Bruxelles-Central / Brussel-Central and follow the exit signs to 'Mont des Arts - SQUARE'.

International trains (Eurostar, Thalys) arrive into Bruxelles-Midi / Brussel-Zuid. From there, it's a simple two-minute train journey to Brussels Central station. Just take any train heading north (free of charge: your ticket to Brussels includes commuting from and to any train station in Brussels), get off at the first stop (Bruxelles-Central / Brussel-Central) and follow exit signs to 'Mont des Arts - SQUARE'.



After landing at Brussels International Airport (Zaventem), make your way from the main arrival hall to level -1. Take a direct train to the city centre. After 17 minutes, get off at the Brussels Central station, and follow the exit signs to 'Mont des Arts / Kunstberg – SQUARE'.



🛱 By road

There are 660 parking spaces right underneath SQUARE at the fee-paying car park named Parking Albertine / Albertina - SQUARE, level -2 (maximum height: 195 cm). You can get in via Place de la Justice - Gerechtsplein, 16 at 1000 Brussels, and then walk straight into the building. Please do not use the other entrance at rue des sols / stuiversstraat which is the loading and unloading street during build-up and dismantling periods.

Public Transportation System

The city centre of Brussels is easily accessible by public transport: train, tram, metro, bus and waterbus.

Inner-city Brussels public transport uses unified ticketing system, so you can use the same ticket for bus, metro, tram or a combination. Important is to validate your card to avoid a fine. Journey tickets (single fare, 10 journeys, return ticket, etc.) offer the possibility to change between lines. This means to pass from one vehicle or station to another. This possibility to connect lines is valid during 60 minutes from the moment of your first validation. If you validate your ticket again after 60 minutes, a new journey will be validated.

Types of public transport tickets

Brussels Intercommunal Transport Company (STIB) offers plenty of possibilities for occasional visitors and tourists, and the most convenient options are single fares and multiple journeys tickets which are available on a **MOBIB card**, that you can buy and load with "tickets" or **contactless tickets**, which are recommended to buy outside the vehicle.

- 1. You can buy **MOBIB** card for €5 in one of KIOSK, BOOTIK or via GO Easy. Then you can purchase a variety of tickets into it:
 - **Single fare Jump**: €2,10 (1 journey including connections during 60 minutes after the first validation)
 - **Return trip Jump**: €4,20 (2 journeys, the 2nd journey being made within a maximum of 24 hours from the first validation of the first journey)
 - Jump 24h, 48h, 72h + Bus Airport: €7,50, €14,00 or €18,00 (unlimited number of journeys over a 24, 48 or 72-hour period depending on the selected duration and starting from the first validation on the STIB network)
 - Single fare & 10 journeys Bus Airport: For 1 journey (purchased outside vehicle): €4,50; For 1 journey (purchased inside vehicle): €6,00; For 10 journeys: €32,00. You can purchase a ticket beforehand at the GO vending machine at the airport which is located on platform C of the bus station
- 2. Contactless tickets. STIB offers you several mobility solutions in the shape of contactless tickets. These are convenient if you only use public transport once in a while or if you have to go to the airport. They have to be validated on a MOBIB validating machine and can be bought at BOOTIK KIOSK GO vending machine; single fare can be also bought in the trams and buses and Airport Bus can also be purchased at busses of line 12 and 21 (only single fare tickets) or beforehand at the GO vending machine at the airport which is located on platform C of the bus station.
 - STIB-MIVB Single fare: 1 fare (purchased outside vehicle): €2,10; 1 fare (purchased inside vehicle) €2,50 (1 journey including connections during 60 minutes after the first validation.)
 - **STIB-MIVB 24 h**: €7;50 (an unlimited number of journeys can be made from the first validation for 24 hours.)
 - **Airport Bus**: For 1 journey (purchased outside vehicle): €4,50; For 1 journey (purchased inside vehicle): €6,00 (1 journey including connections during 60 minutes after the first validation.).

Country Code / Telephone

The international access code for Belgium is +32. Phone cards can be purchased at kiosks and internet/phone shops. Mobile phones with GSM-standard do work without any problems in Belgium.

Electricity

The standard power supply in Belgium is 230 V AC as in most countries of Western Europe. A transformer and an adapter are necessary to use electrical appliances from various countries. Adapters are available in most hardware stores.

Time Zone

Belgium is in the Central European Time Zone. Central European Standard Time (CET) is 1 hour ahead of Greenwich Mean Time (GMT+1).

Opening times in Brussels / Shopping hours

Museum / Sightseeing

Brussels serves as an important landmark in the European history. Touring the city will give you wonderful insights into the culture and traditions of the people here. Visiting the museums in the city will give you a sense of belonging and will also help you to understand the city better. Museums like the Royal Museums of Fine Arts, Kunstberg, René Magritte Museum, etc., are the city's major tourist attractions.

The opening hours of the museums in Brussels vary greatly, the most popular galleries open from 9:30 to 17:00, nevertheless we recommend checking each museum you plan to visit individually. The information about museums, as well as all their greatest events and exhibitions you can find at Brussels Museums' official website.

Shops

Although Brussels is mainly known for its chocolate and beer, there is a great offer in antiques, tapestries, lace, fashion boutiques, etc.

Most shops in Brussels open from Monday to Friday, from 10:00 to 18:00, while the Grand-Place area stays open until approximately 20:00. On Saturday, the stores are usually open longer, closing at 19:00 or 20:00.

Some of the shops located on the city's high streets also open on Sunday and others close on Monday morning.

The 'regular' shopping street is called Rue Neuve, a pedestrian only street with a large selection of shops and a large shopping mall called City2.

Banks

Banks are generally open from 09:00 - 16:00/16:30 (Mon-Fri).

Post offices

Post offices are generally open from 08:30 – 17:45 (Mon-Fri) / 09:00 – 12:00 (Sat)

Restaurants

Restaurants are generally open between 10:00/12:00 – 22:00/24:00 There are literally hundreds of eateries within walking range of SQUARE.

Pharmacies

Most pharmacies are open during normal business hours – from 9:30 to 18:00 (Mon-Fri) and 9:30 – 14:00 on Saturday.
